
Here are the activities for today.

sheets for the activities.













Maths-Tuesday

We are seeing if we can remember to count on and find out how many altogether using the ten frames to help us.




You need your ten frames for this activity and some counters or bricks for the frames.

We will start with a given amount. Here we have two goats.














Today's activities are about taking away. You will need the ten frames and some counters to help you. You are looking for these activity sheets in your learning packs.
















One dinosaur goes away. How many legs now?

You need these sheets for this activity.













We are 2 creatures. We have 6 legs.






pleasure working with all of you while we have been at home, keeping everyone safe!


Our activities this week should be lots of fun that get you outside

Can you show us your ideas for a small garden. Remember it is too small for climbing frames and football pitches.
















Topic- Activity Two
