




Staying safe

You have the right to the best possible health. You should have good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food and a clean environment to stay healthy.




Article 19:







Ask Questions

Ask questions about the story as you read it e.g. What is the story about? Why do you think they made that choice? Was it a good choice? Why did that happen? What do you think will happen next? What was your favourite part of the story? Why?

Make it Fun

Enjoyreading together. Give characters funny voices and engage with the pictures. Make a game out of finding words that rhyme or start with the same sound.

Be Seen

Play 'I Spy' games. Can you find words beginning with...? Can you find a picture of a...? How many... can you see?

Get Out

Go to your public library regularly. Find the books you loved as a kid to read together.

Create

Use reading to inspire drawings or new stories.

Go Online

Look online & in app stores for appropriate word & spelling games.

Make Space

Have a special place or a certain time when you read together.

Read everything out loud.

Books, poems, nursery rhymes, newspaper & magazine articles, food labels.



Ask an adult to test you and see if you can remember all the things that Herman ate?

Outdoor-Make a worm habitat
You will need a glass jar with a
lid with air holes, earth, sand
and worms.

Layer the dirt and sand in a pattern.

Add the worms. Observe over a few days. Don't forget to release your worms back into your garden when you have finished observing them.

Science-Tissue paper worm

Wind some tissue paper around a straw and carefully take it off.
Drop some water onto the worm to see it wiggle and grow.

Creative: Pasta Worm

Can you make your own wiggly worm by threading pasta onto a sting? Can you colour the pasta in to make different patterns. See the previous slide for ideas.

Cooking: Edible worm
