
Staying safe



Reading Introduction





In Whitesands class reading tasks are presented differently for each child. Some of the children are still pre-reading and accessing the 'See and Learn' programme which involves matching pictures.

Other children are working at a sound level and some at a word and sentence level which includes LTR and flashcards.

In addition it is important that all the children hear and listen to stories regularly. Please try and find sometime in the day or evening to sit and share a book with your child. Picture books and tactile books are equally as valuable for the younger children to engage with. Use some titles off the book list opposite to help you.

Whatever level your child is at it would be great if you could spend a few minutes each day practicing. Whether it's See and Learn, LTR or flashcards, you already have resources in your pack. If you require more resources or support to do this, please contact us.

Songs and rhymes play an important part in a child's literacy development and are also a great way to develop interacting and attention. Here are some good examples and ideas for songs and rhymes linked to our theme of 'transport and travel'. Have a go at the ones you know. Row, Row, Row your Boat The wheels on the Bus Down at the station The big ship sails on the ally-ally-oh Bobby shafto A sailor went to sea 5 little men in a flying saucer 5 little firemen Michael Row your boat ashore Can you think of anymore?





This week in maths we are going to focus on









Show your child the coins above do they recognise them?

Money

Give them 2 of each coin and see if they can match them up.

Choose 2, 3 or 4 of the above coins for them to sort depending on their ability - mix up lots of 1p, 2p 5p and 10p coins in a bag for them to pull out one at a time and sort into different bowls or purses - stick with 2 different coins for the younger children.

If they have numicon place pennies over the holes and then count the coins like the pictures below.

If you child can count in 2's put out some 2 pence

coins and point to them whilst counting.

Give your child a 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p coin and


put them in order of value.



ACTIVITY 2 - Numicon

If yo have the plastic numicon tiles the children really enjoying pushing them into the playdough and making the tile shape.

This obviously doesn't work if you only have the paper one's but I know a few people hae purchased the plastic tiles online. See if the children can match the shapes and the imprints left in playdouhh. Even trickier see if they can find two shapes to fit the one imprint e.g a 4 and a 5 to match a number 9 like the photo below.



RWI/Phonics

This week after spending time with the children in school I am going to put the emphasis on writing the letter sounds.

Here are some important point to remember.....


- 1) Make sure you have a line to sit each letter on.
- 2) Say the rhyme before you write each letter so you remember how to form the letter correctly.
- 3) Give your child a small dot as a starting point if they are not sure where to start the letter.
- 4) Most importantly don't take your pencil off the paper while you are writing or tracing each letter it should one smooth continues movement from start to finish.

Here is a good link if you need some reminding of the rhymes and formation.

Remember you should be starting in the same place and forming each letter the same way every time you write it to avoid picking up bad habits.

How quickly can you point to and say all these sounds? Have a go at timing yourself. See if you can get a little quicker each time. Well done if you are under 60 seconds?

Knowledge & Understanding - floating & Sinking
Using a large container, this could be your bath, or
a water tray if you have one, fill it with water and
experiment dropping different objects in to see if
they float or sink? Use the language float and sink
but reinforce this vocabulary with top/bottom,
up/down if this is new to your child. All the
children can experience this even if they are just
watching you.

Extension activity - record your findings in your red book - draw or name the object, predict if it will float or sink and then also record what happened. Was your prediction correct?

Some possible ideas of items to try - cork, ball, key, stone, apple, pencil, lego block etc...
