MESSAGE FROM MR DYER, THE HEAD TEACHER

- It has been excellent catching up with everyone over the last two weeks, whether parents on the yard,
 or children in classes and assemblies. It is a privilege to be part of the enthusiasm that your children
 have for their learning and their lives. There is a real spark in the young people in our community that
 deserves to burn brightly.
- It is still early in the year for news items, but we'll hopefully have more, with photographs, in the next few editions. In the meantime some notices:
- Thank you all very much for working with us on our new asymmetric week. Remember, you need to give 48 hours notice if there is a change to your plans. If children are on our register to stay on Friday afternoons, we cannot let them leave unless we have confirmed parental consent.

I know many of you were able to enjoy the chance to spend more time with your children, and it was certainly a very worthwhile session for teachers in the early stages of developing the new Curriculum for Wales for Gelliswick which has this vision for our young people:

- **1. Ambitious, capable learners** who are ready to learn throughout their lives.
- 2. Enterprising, creative contributors who are ready to play a full part in life and work.
- **3. Ethical, informed citizens** who are ready to be citizens of Wales and the world.
- **4. Healthy, confident individuals** who are ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society.
- With our new school timings it is vital that we make every minute count. School starts at 8.50 a.m. and all children should be in class by 8.50 a.m. If you are experiencing difficulties with this, please contact Emma Evans our Family Liaison Officer for support. The school will contact parents of children who are persistently late to discuss ways to help children be on time.
- I will writing soon with the next stage in our development as a 'Health Promoting School'. You may remember that our Estyn Inspection report noted that: Most pupils understand the need to eat and drink healthily, although a minority do not adhere to the school policy. Fruit snacks will be available to children each day, and we ask for a donation of £2 per week for each child. Please send this in with your child, or hand to your child's class teacher. Thank you very much.
- We have so far had one very good week of attendance (last week), and one pretty poor week (this week).
 There will be more in future editions, but it is very important that we begin as mean to go on. Let's set those good learning habits. Learning happens all the time, but learning in school can only happen in school. Don't let your child be the 'empty desk' in a classroom.
