#### MESSAGE FROM MR DYER, THE HEAD TEACHER



## Gelliswick take their place amongst the 'One in a Million'

Please enjoy this report from pupils in Trefdraeth class (Yr 6):

Last Friday Trefdraeth went on a trip to Haverfordwest to be part of the 'One in a million' Welsh speakers project. Schools from across the county were in attendance including Milford Haven School's year sevens, so it was nice for pupils to meet up with some old Gelliswick friends.



Pupils participated in a range of activities designed to enhance our sense of Welshness. We started the day by participating in a quiz about Welsh history led by a Welsh Youtuber. Then, we spent our morning trying out 12 different activities. We listened to music by a Welsh band who have achieved over 1,000,000 Welsh YouTube hits, we completed a diamond nine activity and we looked at how Welsh can be used in the world of business.

We started our afternoon with a history lesson on some Welsh Icons. We started learning about a man called Tom Williams whose idea it was for Wales to start singing the national anthem before every rugby match. These days, every country around the World has copied us.

We also discovered that there are many famous Welsh people that we knew nothing about. For instance, we learnt about Eileen Beasley, a lady who campaigned for her right to use Welsh, Owain Glyndwr, the last prince of Wales, and Griffith Jones, the man who started the tradition of Welsh people taking great pride in learning and education.



We really enjoyed our day and hope to do more work on some of the famous Welsh people during our lessons in the next few weeks.
