MAIN LEARNING FOCUS - Dividing numbers by halving

Example of method

KQ - What different methods of division are there? Halving, sharing, diagrams, bus stop method, long division.

The method we are working with today is halving. We divide by 2 by halving. We can divide by 4 by halving and halving again and so on.

- Halve amounts of money using partitioning, e.g. £6.74



- Use halving as a strategy in dividing.

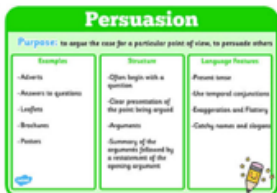

Features	Colour code
Catchy title - Maybe descriptive or uses wordplay	
Introduction gives a reason for the text	
Rhetorical questions	
Informal tone (<i>You'd be a fool to miss out</i>)	
Emotive language - stirs up emotion in the reader (<i>breath taking, romantic</i>)	
Superlative - the most something can be (<i>the highest mountains</i>)	
Hyperbole - Exaggerated language (<i>The views are beyond compare</i>)	
Imperative/bossy phrase (<i>Book now, visit the gift shop, look closely</i>)	

Print out the model text if you have a printer. If not, read the model persuasive advert text online.

In your workbooks, write down tricky vocabulary and use a dictionary/online dictionary to find the definitions and copy them out. We write out the definitions so that we are more likely to remember the meaning and be able to use it in our own writing.

Now, using the toolkit you've made, colour code each one. Re-read the model text, if you have a printed copy, highlight the key features. If you're using an online copy, copy out an example of each feature in your workbook.

Create a story map for the model text. Draw it out in your workbooks using words for key vocabulary where necessary. We create story maps to make sure that we understand the text fully and how it is constructed. Here's an example to remind you of what to do.
