You have the right to the best possible health. You should have good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food and a clean environment to stay healthy.




Article 19:





Reading Introduction





In Whitesands class reading tasks are presented differently for each child. Some of the children are still pre-reading and accessing the 'See and Learn' programme which involves matching pictures.

Other children are working at a sound level and some at a word and sentence level which includes LTR and flashcards.

In addition it is important that all the children hear and listen to stories regularly. Please try and find sometime in the day or evening to sit and share a book with your child. Picture books and tactile books are equally as valuable for the younger children to engage with. Use some titles off the book list opposite to help you.

Whatever level your child is at it would be great if you could spend a few minutes each day practicing. Whether it's See and Learn, LTR or flashcards, you already have resources in your pack. If you require more resources or support to do this, please contact us.

Songs and rhymes play an important part in a child's literacy development and are also a great way to develop interacting and attention. Here are some good examples and ideas for songs and rhymes linked to our theme of 'transport and travel'. Have a go at the ones you know. Row, Row, Row your Boat The wheels on the Bus Down at the station The big ship sails on the ally-ally-oh Bobby shafto A sailor went to sea 5 little men in a flying saucer 5 little firemen Michael Row your boat ashore Can you think of anymore?


Maths Introduction





This week in maths we are going to focus on

Number and Counting



- 1) count up to 10
- 2) count up to 20
- 3) count backwards from 10
- 4) count backwards from 20
 - 5) count in 2's
- 6) give you child a number see if they can clap that many times
- 7) give your child a number see if they can show you that many fingers
 - 8) show your child a set of vehicles see if they can count them accurately
 - 9) practice tracing/tracking & writing numbers 1 10 10) sing some number songs and rhymes together

ACTIVITY 1 Dice Game

There will be a video on class do jo to support this activity. You will also see this activity appearing in the reading and literacy section of the planning over the coming weeks.


To play Fill the board with numbers that your child is working on e.g. 1-5 1-10

1-20+

Get to role a dice and see if they can recognise the numbers they land on. Play with a sibling or an adult if it helps the child engage. Change it to spots they have to count to add variety or very simple sums.

ACTIVITY 2 - Numicon Matching

Keep going with this activity if your child has it in their pack. If not have a go at the counting activity below.

ACTIVITY 3 Shape Game

Hope you found this activity fun. This week we are going to repeat it but we are also going to extend it for those who what a bit more challenge. If your child is still working on identifying shapes continue as before otherwise why not give this a go? Add some extra shapes of different colours and different sizes and give your child instructions to follow for example.... can you pick up a big blue square? Can you pick up a small green circle? etc... Reverse the acitivty and let your child give you instrcutins on what

shape to pick up.






RWI/Phonics

Well done you have now completed all the RWI set 1 speed sounds, with the exception of th, nk & ng. Ignore these ones for now as they are really tricky and we are going to work on them once we are back in class. We are going to continue to practice all the sounds over the remainder of the term. I know you will find some easier to recognise and name than others so really concentrate on practicing the ones you are not so sure of.

Remember to have a go at naming them, finding them and writing them.

Try some of the activities below using the word mat opposite. Good Luck!

- 1) Get an adult to time you saying all your speed sounds how quick were you? Practice every day and see if you get quicker. Keep a record of your times in your red book.
- 2) Call out the sounds in a random order for your child to identify. How quickly can they find them once you have said them?
- 3) Say the following vehicles and see if your child can hear and find the initial letter for that word? car, bus, train, lorry, boat, plane & van.





Literacy Tasks



This week we are going to continue to practice sorting transport pictures.

Stick with two if your child is still not consistently sorting two, but move onto

> three if they are now confident enough.

ACTIVITY 2

Keep going with these writing mazes. Remember you can track each maze a few times in different colours and different media. For example firstly track it with your finger, then again with a pencil, then a third time with a coloured pencil and finally use a felt pen.

This way you get lots of extra writing practice.



ACTIVITY 3

Although there isn't a new bucket time video this week, remember to watch Miss Whatlings video and try and think of an activity of your own. Transport should lend itself to lots of fun and exciting ideas! Let us know what you come up with.

Physical & Numeracy - 'Shapes'

Here is a games you could play to reinforce our maths work on shape.

Draw lots of large shapes either on pieces of paper on the floor if you are playing inside, or chalked on the ground if you're outside. Make a shape dice by covering a box and drawing pictures of different shapes on each side. Role the dice, name the shape and run to find the same shape marked on the floor. Make the distance the child must run further if you want them to get more exercie. Change the way the child travels if you want to vary it a little e.g. hop, skip, jump to the different shapes etc...
