You have the right to the best possible health. You should have good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food and a clean environment to stay healthy.




#### Article 19:



#### Maths Introduction and WAGOLL

But later it has wings and can fly!





## Maths Introduction and WAGOLL

We are going to learn about the days of the week and know there are 7 days in a week. Talk about events using today, yesterday and tomorrow.

Learn about the **months** of the year and pick out special dates such as their birthday.

You could look at a calendar displaying days and months.

Our sound of the week is oo, Poo at the zoo!






## Maths Introduction and WAGOLL

Today we are learning to tell the **time** to the hour using an analogue **clock**. Learning the language of **o'clock** and understanding the **hour** hand is the shorter hand and the **minute** hand is the longer hand.

Read the time to the hour and know when the minute hand is pointing upwards to the number 12 it is an o'clock time, and understand they need to look at the hour hand to see which hour it is.

## Maths Introduction and WAGOLL

Today we are learning to tell the time to the half hour. Learning the language of half past.


At half past the hour the minute hand has travelled halfway around the clock from the twelve and is pointing at the six and the hour hand is halfway between the hours e.g. halfway between eleven and twelve.

# Literacy Introduction

On Tuesday we looked at the oo sound where two o letters make a new sound together- oo, poo at the zoo




