To help children learning to read at home during school closure, Ruth Miskin the creator of **Read**Write Inc. is streaming weekday spelling lessons on YouTube channel.



1st Read together

First read together. Each book has a lot of new vocabulary. In this read the adult on film and your child at home should be reading together. It's a slow process the first time as skills taught previously are used to work out new vocabulary:


'Fred out a word' loud or in your head- sounding out the letters and blending them to make a word.

Read on the sentence and go back- to find a word with similar sounds that would make sense in

the context.

Look at the picture- to make sense of the story and what is being read.





Questions to think about.

When children interact with the story by thinking about questions, they understand it at a much deeper level. RWI encourages the children to look back through the story and find or prove their answer. This makes tomorrows read easier the text more familiar and help to remember some of the repetitive vocabulary.

Home learning

Boost your learning complete a task

Make a pasta dish with an adult use my recipe or find another

Tomato Sauce

Makes 10 small servings



Ingredients

2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil 1 medium onion, chopped 2 garlic cloves, crushed 2 x 400q cans of chopped tomatoes or 1kg ripe tomatoes 2 tsp balsamic vinegar 2 tsp sugar 1 large handful basil leaves, torn into small pieces Salt and freshly ground black pepper Finely grated parmesan cheese, to serve 500g whole wheat pasta.

Equipment

2 medium sized pan 1 large sized pan Colander Grater Teaspoon Tablespoon Chopping board Safe Knife Oven gloves



Safety Note: Very close adult supervision is needed when using the hob.

Step 1. Heat the oil in a medium saucepan and gently cook the onion for around 5 minutes until softened.

Step 2. Stir in the garlic and cook for a few minutes. Then add in the tomatoes, balsamic vinegar and sugar.



Step 3. Season with a tiny pinch of salt and pepper, then simmer for around 15 minutes, stirring occasionally

Step 4. Stir in the basil leaves, leaving a few to garnish, and cook for a further 5 minutes.



Step 5. Fill a large pan of water, ¾ full, and bring to a rolling boil. Add a pinch of salt. Cook the pasta according to the packet instructions. Once the pasta is cooked, carefully drain in a colander over the sink. Stir the pasta into the sauce. An adult should remove the pan and drain the hot water. Serve with the parmesan and torn basil leaves sprinkled over the top.
